Keystone Kamping

We all enjoy sharing stories about our Airstream experiences so this month we're introducing a new section to highlight what our members have been up to recently. Just after Memorial Day we took off for a week's excursion through the Laurel Highlands of western PA. Our trip began south of the border in Cumberland, MD where we had beautiful weather and a leisurely ride on the Western Maryland Scenic Railroad. The tracks are now joined with a scenic and very 'bike-able' railtrail. Since it is uphill 16 miles from Cumberland to Frostburg, the train offers a 1-way trip up the trail so bikers can then coast back down to Cumberland. We opted for the roundtrip! We then wandered over to Farmington, PA where we visited the Nemacolin Woodlands Resort and took in its eclectic collection of art and structural design. Next stop was nearby Fort Necessity where the French-Indian war began, and Polymath Park where there are 3 Frank Lloyd Wright houses (his 'Duncan' house and 2 built by apprentice Peter Berndtson). If you are a Wright fan, Fallingwater and Kentuck Knob are also in the area.

Following Farmington we headed up through the Laurel Highlands to a rather damp, but pretty site in Somerset. We visited the new Flight 93 Memorial, a somber tribute to those who stopped the 9/11 flight headed for the Capitol. The Park Service has done a great job and we encourage you all to

stop as you travel the turnpike. Later we visited the Johnstown Flood Memorial, located just outside of South Fork where the earthen dam gave way in 1889 and resulted in 20 million tons of water from the then Lake Conemaugh crashing down the valley, devastating the area in a matter of minutes. It is a chilling reminder of forces of nature.

On a lighter note, we ended our trip with a fun stop at Horseshoe Curve and the Railroaders Museum in Altoona (a combined ticket and both sites have great RV parking). We were treated to 2 trains rounding the half-mile curve that continues to be in use since construction back in the late 1800's. The museum offers a fantastic history of PRR (Pennsy) railroading in the area with lots of pictures, actual (big!) equipment and a cute park with several rail cars the kids (young and old) can climb through. We stopped that night at Cowan's Gap state park just off the turnpike near Sideling Hill. Recently refurbished, the sites are spacious and level (still electric only) and the park is beautiful. The weather gods were gracious - we had a wonderful evening (happy hour with the pellet stove) and night (windows open with a light chill and sounds of nearby creek) before heading home.
